Qualified Charitable Contributions from Your IRA

With tax time fast approaching, the Stewardship Committee wanted to make you aware of a potential tax saving device. The IRS mandates that those 70 ½ years old must take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from their traditional IRA each year. This amount is normally taxable in the year it is withdrawn. However, if you donate funds directly from your IRA to a qualified charity, such as First Christian Church, you don't have to pay taxes on the money and it still counts towards your RMD. This will also lower your gross income, which may result in less of your Social Security being taxed, lower Medicare premiums for higher income taxpayers, or a chance to qualify for other deductions or tax credits that would otherwise not have been available to you.

As an example, if the RMD from your IRA for the year is \$4,000, this would normally increase your gross income by \$4,000, and cost you \$880 in additional taxes that year (at the 22% marginal tax rate). If you donated the total amount to a qualified charity, your gross income would be \$4,000 less and you would not owe any taxes on it. You can also choose to donate a smaller portion of it. To do a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD), you simply instruct the firm that manages your IRA to direct some or all of your RMD to one or more charities. The firm must send the money directly to the charity, or send you a check made out to the charity, which you forward (you can't collect the money and then donate it for the QCD to count).

There are a couple of things to keep in mind. If you donate directly from an IRA to a charity, you can not deduct it as a charitable donation on your tax return, although you can still itemize other charitable deductions if you have enough expenses to itemize. And this only works for IRAs. You can't use it with a 401k, 457, 403b, or other employer sponsored retirement savings plans.

Lastly, as you go through your homes and start spring cleaning, there are some things we could use in the education wing:


- A working dvd player with remote so Sunday school and other children'sprogramming can use educational videos as needed.


On Thursday nights, our children have been learning about prayer and God's answers. Here is a picture of one of our children's prayer board the children made recently.

beautiful and heartfelt results. They are such a blessing!


