

Pastor's Jottings

"12 The body is one, even though it has many parts, all the parts – many though they are – comprise a single body. And so it is with Christ. 13 It was by one Spirit that all of us, whether we are Jews or Greeks, slaves or citizens, and were baptized into one body. All of us have been given to drink of the one Spirit. 14 And that Body is not one part; it is many." (1 Corinthians 12: 12-14 NEB)

Many times I am inspired by God's creation as it teaches us lessons about life. A life like we find in Scripture like the one from 1 Corinthians. In this there is one lesson that struck me recently that not only speaks to the truth of the Scripture but to the church and to life that the Body is not just one part but it is many.

So, you might ask where I saw this great vision. Well it was around a new bird feeder Mary and I set up this spring on our patio at the town house we rent. An odd place you might say well maybe. Yet let me explain. You see, we have many creatures that live in our area. We have squirrels, rabbits, and a large number of birds of all types. The birds come in all sizes from the smallest wren to the largest of the black birds, the crow. Now I am sure you are saying that we have them in our neighborhood too. This is not You are so right. However, they work as one body around the feeder although there are many, to make sure all get fed. First the feeder is set so as the birds feed and the feeder lowers so the feed stays at the top. Well it really doesn't work that well and the larger birds really don't fit on the ledge to eat.

So where is the lesson? Well the small birds feed from the feeder throwing the larger seeds, especially the sunflower seeds to the ground. On the ground the larger birds, the squirrels, and the rabbits feed on the seeds the smaller birds pitch out. Each group on the ground eats just what they need, and although they do feed alone often, they also at times feed together as one. Do you get the picture now? In nature these different groups are still one. They eat and share what they have found so that all may prosper and grow even if it is just fat. Or although they are many and very different they are one in the echo system or one in the body.

In the church we are the same. We all have different gifts. We are in many different shapes, colors, cultures, and orientations yet although we many we are still one. We are one because we are of the same Spirit, one in the same Lord, one in the same call and baptism. For that reason we may be many parts yet we are one. As one we serve the community we live in. We serve it out of love for all because we are one.

I know this summer is different. We have been locked up for a year to eighteen months and the great vastness of God's creation is calling to us. Yet remember we are one and as one we still have to serve. That is to say the church doesn't go on vacation. So when you think about summer, think about the body too. We need to make sure all are fed so to speak so all many prosper and grow fat in the Spirit. We truly need to make sure the body of Christ moves forward. So include some time, this summer, to be together and work together as a church. For we may be many we are still one and it takes all to move forward and be ready for the newness of the year and new life as one.

Dear Members of the First Christian Church,

It is with some sadness and a heavy heart that I resign from my position as Youth Leader at the First Christian Church effective the end of this month. I have been grappling for some time now with the feeling that God is calling me to take up more leadership with my position as an elder of the church. I am feeling led, in particular, to help build up our ministry to the homebound and to people who may have trouble accessing our church community by physically entering our church. In that vein, I am also feeling called to continue to work on outreach on the facebook page and through other avenues that can help us to make sure that, even when our building based programming returns, our ability to help those who cannot come into our church because of distance, lack of transportation, poor health, or mental health issues will continue to access the message of God's love and our community's love for them through bible study, messages, and other innovative programs from their homes wherever they are.

Meanwhile, I am mindful that our youth program now boasts a large number of children who are new teens (as well as almost teens), a group of upper elementary, and another group of lower elementary school kids. Our youth need not only a rebuilding of what we had before the pandemic but an expansion of services that match our growing needs: like teen lock-ins, larger mission projects, and a 12-18 class. While my heart wishes I had more to give, I have come to realize that I do not have the personal resources to manage both the youth program and the elder based ministry to which I feel God calling me. It is my fervent hope that when we find a youth leader, there will continue to be places in which I will be able to volunteer to teach and work with the youth. My commitment to them and the growth of their faith remain fervent, I just cannot be the youth leader this church needs right now and must step back into a position that is more flexible so that I have the time I need to pursue the other ministries God has for me.

I fully intend to continue to volunteer in Caraway and to support the youth as much as I can as a volunteer and truly see this less of a "stepping down" and more as a "stepping up" to the opportunities that God is calling me to. It has been an honor working with the children and I am forever grateful and thankful for the honor you have done for me by allowing me to be a youth leader here. I had attended here less than a year before the last youth leader left and you encouraged me to step in and eventually hired me to this position. You truly took a leap of faith with me and while I know I may have made mistakes, please know I always tried my hardest to do my best for this church and its youth. It is time now for me to take a leap of faith again and I hope you will pray for me as I try to follow where God is leading.


